## Is your student at risk of dropping out of school?

The desire to drop out of high school typically builds day by day and happens over a period of time. Factors that contribute to students dropping out include:

- Absences/Tardies. Students who miss more than five days in a term often fall behind and feel frustrated in their ability to catch-up and decide to give up.
- 2. Lack of engagement in class, often with behavioral problems. Teens who don't keep up with assignments, or who are in constant tousle, may end up dropping out.
- 3. Difficulty in core subjects. Students who are failing in math, science, English or social studies may have to repeat a grade. Teens who are held back often decide to drop out.

If you see these signs, contact our counselors. Ask for help getting your student back on track!
